 Post HS Career: Played at Oregon State College, lettering three years each in two sports; Played for Brooklyn Dodgers of National Football League two years

### Stan Bozich \*

Sports Played: *Hockey, Baseball*  
 High School Honors: Three-year baseball letterman; All-PIL centerfielder and team captain; led PIL in hitting with .437 percentage; played in 1949 Shrine All-Star Game; Two-year hockey letterman; All-PIL goalie  
 Post HS Career: Four-year baseball letterman at University of Portland; team captain; 35 years as high school coach, teacher, counselor

### A.P. Gibson

Coach 1927-1939

Sport Played: *Wrestling*  
 High School Honors: Coached wrestling from 1927 to 1939, guiding his teams to nine State Championships and three second place finishes

### Clifford "Chief" Mclean

1932

Sports Played: *Football, Basketball, Baseball*  
 High School Honors: Three-year basketball letterman; First team All-Tournament and team MVP senior year; Two-time All-PIL baseball catcher; Halfback on football team  
 Post HS Career: Coached in Medford schools for 32 years

### Raymond "Butch" Morse

Sports Played: *Football, Basketball, Baseball*  
 High School Honors: Four-year letterman in football; All-City team, captain, MVP on 1928 City Championship team; Basketball team's leading scorer in 1929-30 season; Played baseball four years and participated in track and field four years  
 Post HS Career: First Team All-Coast football team while playing at University of Oregon and played in East-West Shrine All-Star game; Played for Detroit Lions of National Football League for six years

### Jim Newcomb

1949

Sport Played: *Cross Country*  
 High School Honors: Three-time PIL and two-time State Cross Country Champion; lost only once in three years of competition; Finished second in State Meet as a freshman; led Benson to State Championship in 1946 and 1947; Broke 31-year-old State Mile Record as a sophomore with 4:30.8; High School All-American in 1948; ran fastest high school mile in country as a junior at 4:23.6; Three-time PIL mile champion; won State Mile title in 1948

### Charles Patterson

1932

Sport Played: *Basketball*  
 High School Honors: Two-year basketball letterman; All-City team and Second Team All-Tournament while playing for 1932 team that was 25-2, losing to eventual State Champion Astoria in semi-finals  
 Post HS Career: Moved to University of Oregon from Southern Oregon Normal College along with Coach Howard Hobson and became first African American to play basketball in the Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division.

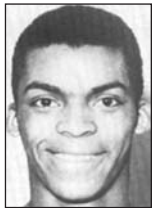

### Art Shepherd

Sports Played: *Football, Basketball, Baseball*  
 High School Honors: All-City football team in 1944; First Team All-City Basketball Team four years (unanimous junior and senior years); Fourth in league scoring senior year; First Team All-City Baseball shortstop four years.



### Tim Vollmer \*

 High School Honors: PIL discus champion three consecutive years, setting PIL Meet discus record of 174 feet, 1/2 inch; State discus champion junior and senior years; winning throw of 178 feet, 10 inches senior year one of longest in nation that year; Three-year basketball letterman
