Boys Tennis

Regular Season Winners - Lincoln

The Lincoln boy's tennis team won their first team title since 1988 after coming in 2nd place behind Jesuit for the past 3 state tournaments (2017, 2018 & 2019 – the 2020 and 2021 tournaments were canceled due to Covid). The team finished the season with a record of 10-0 in league matches. As a #3 seed entering the OSAA state championships, sophomore Will Semler had a bye the first round and did not lose a set across his four matches, crowning him the STATE CHAMPION. He defeated #2 seed Tannor Binder of Beaverton.





Lincoln's Alex Dinkov took out top seeded Gus Krauel from Central Catholic in the quarterfinals, only to lose to his teammate, Semler, in the semifinals. He took home the 4th place trophy.

Besides Dinkov and Semler, Josiah Mones of Grant advanced to the 2nd round of the OSAA State Championships, where he faced and was defeated by Semler.

Doubles partners Cooper Lahti and Sean Miller of Lincoln were seeded #1 headed into the state championships but fell short to #6 seeds Pandya and Tran of Jesuit. Lahti and Miller were the PIL District Champions in the Boys Doubles bracket.

Girls Tennis

Regular Season Winners - Grant

Wells' Claudia Barberi took home the championship in the PIL girl's tennis district tournament. As a 6th seed entering the OSAA State Championships, she advanced to the quarterfinals, only to lose to the eventual state champion, Lauren Han of Clackamas. As a team, Wells had a top 10 finish in the state tournament for the 2nd year in a row (2019 & 2022) and for the second time since 2004. Wells' doubles team, Julia Boboc & Kate Rodgers, advanced to the Round of 16 in the OSAA State Championships.



Marina Seidl of Grant won the consolation bracket in the OSAA state championships. After losing in round #1, she went on to win 4 consecutive matches, naming her the Consolation winner.

Lincoln's Reece Emmert and Elle Newton won the PIL District title in doubles, advancing to the state tournament and winning the Consolation bracket. Doubles partners CaliRose Karstad and Jessie Cobban advanced to the state quarterfinals, losing to the #4 seed from Westview. Karstad and Cobban won the doubles bracket in the PIL District tourney.

Track & Field

Boys District Meet Winners - Roosevelt

Girls District Meet Winners - Lincoln

The Wells boys track & field team placed 9th in state. Their 4x400 team was crowned the PIL District Champions. Nolan Malcomson of Wells was the OSAA State Champion in the 300M Hurdles, also taking home the PIL District Championship trophy in this event. His time in the 300 hurdles broke the school record held by his event coach, Sol Sallos.

Franklin's Charlie North, the PIL Athlete of the Year in Track & Field, finished 3rd at the OSAA state championships in the

3000. He was the PIL District Champion in the 1500 and 3000.



Franklin's Kiaya Robertson (#1 pictured to the left) broke the 2008 school record in the 800 by 1.2 seconds on March 30th. The previous record was held by Julia Fonk who was a 1500-meter state champion and went on to have a successful track and cross country career at the University of Portland. At the time, Kaiya's time of 2:11.82

was ranked #17 in the nation. She also currently holds the PIL record in the 1500 meter at 4:30.43.

Twins Enrico & Antony Ganz from Lincoln have become some of Oregon's best high school sprinters. Antony had a 6th place finish at the OSAA state championships in the 100, while Enrico finished 3rd in the 400. Both athletes will be competing at the collegiate level – Enrico at the University of Rochester and Antony at the University of British Columbia.

Jefferson track & field had the largest number of participants in recent years with 80 participants. Sophomore Josvah

Clark Anderson finished 4th in the 110 meter hurdles at the District Meet, with senior Br'Yana Brown-Dunn finishing 3rd. Junior Trinity Montgomery qualified for the OSAA State Championships in the 100 and 200 meter after finishing 2nd in both events at the District meet. She placed 7th overall in the 100 meter finals. Senior Jillian Miller, PIL District Champion in the High Jump.



competed at her first state meet, finishing 8th overall and jumping her PR of 5'2. Chenoa Porter, recipient of the PIL Field Event Athlete of the Year award, finished 3rd overall at the state championships with a PR of 6'4 in the high jump.





The girls 4x400 relay team from Wells took home the PIL District championship trophy, while the team placed 11th overall at the OSAA State Championships. Charlotte Richman finished 3rd in the 3000, breaking her own school record and was ranked #6 in the US with this time. Cleveland's Piper Harmon was a PIL District Champion in the Discus, while Eli Flamoe earned a District championship in the High Jump.



Roosevelt's Lily Jones has gained national attention for her athletic achievements. Her personal best time of 11.44 seconds in the 100 meters is the third-fastest for high school girls in Oregon history. Jones won the PIL district title in the 100 meters with a time of 12.61 seconds and was 2nd in the 200 with a time of 26.21 seconds as a freshman in 2019. As a junior, Jones ran the 100 in 11.97 seconds at the

District Meet, becoming one of just a few Oregon high school female sprinters to finish in under 12 seconds and was 4th in the 200 with a time of 25.37 seconds, both being Roosevelt school records. At the Husky Classic indoor meet in Seattle this past February, Jones posted a time of 7.37 seconds in the 60 meters, the fastest in Oregon girls prep history and the 8th fastest indoor time for high school girls in the nation this year. Jones will be receiving a full scholarship to run Track for the University of Oregon in the Fall of 2022.

Roosevelt's Anna Lanigan will be participating in cross country and track at Gonzaga University in the fall of 2022. She holds the school records in the 1500 and 3000. Not only does she excel athletically, she is also graduating with a 4.0 and receiving the prestigious Seal of Biliteracy for having studied and attained proficiency in Spanish.





Boys & Girls Golf

Cleveland's Kyra Ly is an OSAA STATE CHAMPION, making history as she scored the *lowest score across all gender and divisions in OSAA history*. She will be playing golf at Oregon State next year. She and Pippa Goodbody from Grant qualified for the state championships, along with Emma Marrs (Grant), Stella Blaha (Cleveland) and the entire Wells team.

Wells' girls team

finished the season by placing 8th at the OSAA State Championships. Well's #1 player, Helen Brodahl placed 2nd as an individual, shooting one over par 73, two days in a row. The team won the PIL league title for the 4th straight year.

Cleveland's Sal Sigstad and Well's Spencer Lee and Lucas Devlin qualified for the OSAA Boys Golf State Championships, along with

Grant's entire team, after a stellar performance at the district golf tournament.





Lincoln's Tanner Overby finished 7th at the OSAA state championships, with teammate Quinn Hefele finishing in 10th place (pictured above). Lincoln's boys' team had a 4th place finish overall at the championships.

Youth Sports

The PIL offers Youth Track & Field and Baseball during the Spring season.

The PIL offers the biggest youth sports program in the state. Current offerings during the fall are football, volleyball, and cross country. Winter season offers boys and girls basketball and wrestling, with the spring season offering track & field & baseball (Madison & Roosevelt clusters only). Teams are organized by clusters, and youth coaches are paid a stipend after passing PPS employment requirements.

This Spring, the PIL Youth Track and Field program had over 1,200 participants, with Cleveland and Wells each accounting for over 200. Participants can compete at the Oregon State Youth Track Meet if they meet qualifying results at the PIL District Meet.

The Youth Sports program is an integral part of staying competitive at the high school level. It offers younger students an opportunity to try different sports, make new friends, stay active and gain mentors through their coaches.
