State Championships for Middle School - "Meet of Champions"

The Oregon Middle School "Meet of Champions" is considered to be the state championships for middle school track & field. PIL athletes saw huge success at this meet that was held at Corvallis High School on May 24th. The biggest accomplishment came from the Wells boys cluster, who beat out 64 other teams to take home the state championship trophy. Out of the possible 59 teams who competed on the girls side, the Grant cluster took home 4th place, while the Cleveland cluster finished 5th overall. Roosevelt's Isaya Migani

also received 2nd place medals for the long jump and 100m dash while setting personal records in both.


