MISSION STATEMENT: The Portland Interscholastic League Hall of Fame supports the athletic programs and facilities of the Portland public high schools financially and as requested by the district, and honors student-athletes, coaches, administrators and others for their outstanding performances and contributions through annual selections to its Hall of Fame.

The PIL Hall of Fame would like to thank Jeff Erdman, PIL Assistant Athletic Director,

for taking time to be interviewed for this article.

None who read this article will be surprised that Covid-19 had an impact on the PIL, its athletes, coaches and fans. We are excited that things seem to be improving and we are feeling positive about future prospects.

Rather than deal with the misery of the pandemic, we would like to share some of the positives that have resulted from reworking and re-thinking some long held processes and traditions. A period like this has generated a lot of creativity in order to achieve our primary objective: to get the kids back on the courts and fields for their various sports.

As a recipient of the PIL Hall of Fame newsletter, it is likely that you are among the many that see the real benefits of sport to the students mental and physical wellbeing. Physical exercise, mental stimulation, competition and the sensation of teamwork can combine to make the school experience more memorable, satisfying and rewarding. It can also contribute to enhanced classroom performance.

By the time you read this, the current school year will have ended. In spite of the obstacles, the PIL can look back on that most recent year and take pride in having:

- Conducted league games for fall, winter and spring sports thereby "getting the kids back on the field".
- Conducted games against teams in the other four Portland area conferences: Three Rivers, Metro, Mt. Hood and Pacific.

- Expanded the number of possible competitive events with the addition of "culminating weeks" where teams of all those conferences were ranked (top to bottom) and then inter-league games between well-matched opponents created a "post-season" playoff atmosphere.
- Adopted procedures to protect athletes and fans from Covid while shortening time to check in to an event. Specifically, every person attending a game had to be tested, registered and kept distant in grandstands, rest rooms and on team benches. Later, family members, pre-tested, coming to games received a QR code as their entry identification.
- Reduced expenses in response to decreased ticket sale revenue.
- Maintained investment in middle school programs without interruption.
- Took real joy from seeing the faces and hearing the energized voices of the athletes and coaches who are so happy to be "back at it".
- Moved forward with the Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA). This program has become a staple in the PIL process. The PCA goal is to educate athletes, coaches and parents/fans on matters of respect and treatment of othersespecially in the competitive athletic environment. The execution of that goal comes through the training of Stu-

dent Athlete Leadership Teams (SALT) made up of a representative group that closely matches the ethnic and gender balance of the school. Those selected SALT athletes would receive training that would help them identify the challenges (bullying, racism, harassment along with a host of other issues common in most of today's schools), seek next steps to improve on those situations and then spread the word among fellow students, other teams in the PIL and, eventually, other leagues in an initiative that will help create the kind of schools, leaders and world that we want and need.

We have also had the thrill of experiencing the reversal of a trend. After years of declining student population at our schools, we are seeing growth once again and that is especially true at the newly renovated schools. Roosevelt, Franklin, Grant and the newly named Leodis V. McDaniel High School (formerly Madison High School) will all be completed by the start of school in the fall. The new Lincoln High School is being constructed at this time on the previous site of the stadium field. When completed, the old building will be razed and a new field and stadium built in that location. Work on Benson is next up.



A PIL Hall of Fame Tribute to the Krieger Family and Broadmoor Golf Course

In appreciation, we gratefully acknowledge the Host and Home of the Hall of Fame's primary source of support for the last 15 years—the Krieger Family and Broadmoor Golf Course.

It was in 2005 that Don Krieger and Mel Krause, Hall of Fame member and Board member/Secretary, forged an agreement to relocate the PIL Hall of Fame's fund-raising golf tournament to Broadmoor.

Don's son Scott Krieger, a 1976 grad of Wilson High, has been serving as General Manager of Broadmoor since 1992. Scott's great-grandmother along with five aunts converted the family's Rose City Dairy to the golf course, opening on Labor Day, 1931. The course was sold on Oct. 25, 2020 for industrial development and wetlands.

I have to say that I have enjoyed sports since I was a small boy.

My father, Harold Taylor, started coaching baseball when I was nine-years-old and continued until I reached high school.

Small played a factor in that, as much as I loved football, I soon found out that I was better suited for wrestling, baseball and skiing! Skiing eventually won out but I've always been a baseball fan as well as anything U of O Ducks!!

My dad always told me that if he had enough money, he would have gone to OSU. Well, he didn't and years later he was introduced to a man named Len Casanova and the rest is, as they say, history.

I was truly blessed to have the parents that I did. They were kind and thoughtful and let me have free reign to do what I wanted (within reason). I learned so many valuable life lessons from them.

Being so interested in sports as well as the development of youngsters, my father started sponsoring the Putnam High School summer baseball program around 1965 and we continue this sponsorship to this day. I can hardly believe it's been 55 plus years!

There have been many other events we have been fortunate to be involved in such as Pop Warner football, the famous Portland Lobo semi-pro baseball team of the '70s which produced so many fine young men who went on to teach and coach the next generation, or two, of student athletes.

I have found much satisfaction and enjoyment in participating in and awarding scholarships to students in the North Clackamas and Estacada school districts for the Harold Taylor Scholarship Fund and a fairly new one at South Wasco County High School, all for students who have had some difficulties in school but are determined to better themselves with further education in academics or trade school. We also actively sup-

port programs at the U of O, OSU and the Oregon Humane Society to name a few.

It has also been a pleasure to be involved with the PIL in helping sponsor the Mel Krause Memorial Golf Tournament. My dad was a friend of Mel and it seemed a perfect fit. I have also found it enjoyable to contribute to middle school sports programs, through the PIL Youth Sports Foundation.

It was my father's firm belief, and mine, that sports can be a window to the future.
