Jason Franklin (Benson High, 1995) Basketball



Taryn Tarver Bishop (Benson High School, 1992) Track and Field



Post High School Honors: BS degree in Broadcast Journalism from the University of Oregon, 1998. Ran sprints on the University of Oregon Track Team in 1996 and 1997. Viewed by Benson coaches as one of the greatest female sprinters in Benson Track and Field history. She is a dynamic mother of six, a model, an author, a mentor, a weight loss consultant, a motivational speaker, and a celebrity life coach, but the one above all is a modern-day Prophetess. Prophetess Taryn is the founder of TNT Global Ministries which has a weekly online class which allows viewers the opportunity to tune in and receive a renewed mind, body, and spirit.

Senior Class Student of the Year, Cleveland High Band 2 years, PPS Outdoor School Counselor two years, STARS Program Counselor.

<u>Post High School Career:</u> 4-years Football letterman at Linfield College, Most Inspirational Player 2010, Team Captain. BS degree, double major in Business and Communication Arts, 2011. Training Program Manager – Elevation Franchise Ventures, LLC, 2013-2015. MENA Regional Mgr – Elevation Franchise Ventures, LLC, 2016-19. 
Don Nelson (Cleveland High School, Coach) Baseball and Soccer

Post High School Career: Portland State University, 3-year letterman 1971-73. Played City-League baseball 1970-1985 with Aden-Josie and Kuzman Lumber. Taught PE at 4 different elementary schools in Portland education for 30 years; at Cleveland, coached Jayvee and Freshman Baseball for 39 years, varsity Soccer 7 years and many more years of JV/Frosh for boys and girls. Babe Ruth baseball coach in the Cleveland district for many years. Ron Pheister Asst. Coach of the Year 1989-90; PIL Asst. Coach of the Year 2011; Merit Award from Active and Old-timers baseball Assn. for Summer Baseball Clinics, 2012; and NW Baseball Coaches Merit Award, 2007.

<u>High School Honors:</u> 3 Cross Country letters, 4 Wrestling letters, 2 Golf letters. 1st in PIL Wrestling as a Junior (123lb) and Senior (130lb); Team MVP both years. Student Body Vice President

as a Junior and President as a Senior. On Speech/Debate team two years. 3.87 GPA.

Post High School Honors: BA degree in American Studies from Pomona College, 1982-86; Master of Arts in Teaching from Claremont University,1988. 4-year Wrestling letterman at Pomona; 3x SCIAC League champions last three years. Team MVP 1985 and 1986. National Qualifier for the NCAA III Championship Tournament. Claremont College representative for the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics Comm. Asst. Principal Milwaukie HS 2000-04; Principal Sunrise Middle School, 2004-07; Principal Springwater Trail HS, 2007-15; Superintendent at Knappa School District, 2015; Principal at Jewell School District, 2016-19; and Principal at Gresham HS, 2019 to retirement in 2019

Owin Hays (Franklin High School, 1990) Football, Track & Field

High School Honors: 4 Football Letters, 1st Team All-PIL linebacker and defensive captain. Led team in tackles and was named defensive player of the year. 3 Track and Field Letters, runner up in the PIL Javelin as a junior.

Post High School Career: Injury prevented Owin from pursuing a college football career. He is the executive producer and host of NW-based TV show Outdoor GPS, the only live interactive fishing/hunting show in the country. He has averaged 3.5 shows per week for the past 15 years; FOX 12 picked up the show from NBC Sports NW due to its popularity.



Ron Johnson (Franklin High School, 1960) Football, Wrestling, Track & Field, Baseball


High School Honors: 4 letters in Wrestling, 3 in Football, and 2 each in Track & Field and Baseball. He excelled in wrestling with PIL runner-up finishes in 123lbs and 130lbs as a freshman and sophomore and PIL and State champion as a junior and senior. He was Franklin's Valedictorian in 1960 and served as Student Body President.

<u>Post High School Career:</u> Ron earned a BS in Mechanical Engineering at University of Washington and continued to excel in wrestling with 4 letters and the Outstanding Wrestler of the 1964 Pac 6 Tournament, winner of the 157lb weight class; team captain. He wrestled for the Multnomah Athletic Club from 1965-73. Ron founded a Mechanical Company and sold it after 15 years and served 40 years as a registered plumber. Ron helped start the West Linn Youth Soccer and Youth Wrestling Clubs in 1975, which are still going strong. The wrestling club of grade school participants won the State title in 2023. Ron's son Lance coaches wrestling at Ida B. Wells.

Amy Papasadero (Franklin High School, 1998) Softball

High School Honors: 4 letters in Softball. 1st Team All-PIL in Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. 2nd Team All-State as a Junior and Senior. Team MVP and PIL Player of the Year as a Senior.

<u>Post High School Career:</u> Played softball at the College of the Siskiyous 1998-1999; Mt. Hood Community College 1999-2000. JV Softball Coach at Madison 2005-08. Varsity Asst Softball Coach at Franklin 2009-13 and 2017 to present. Working for Portland Public Schools from 2018 to present as Lead Campus Safety Associate at Cleveland High.

Beryl (Hap) Piper (Franklin High School, Coach)

Hap Piper taught PE, Health and Drivers Education and started and coached Volleyball, Basketball and Softball. She taught at Franklin High School from 1960 until retirement in 1994. She was instrumental in starting the girls' basketball program at Franklin High School in 1970; four years later the girls' Volleyball program and soon thereafter Softball. She was an ambassador for softball, playing first base and pitcher for Erv Lind Florists and on a traveling team that flew on Air Force planes to play teams in Taiwan, Okinawa, The Philippines and Japan. After games they would put on camps/clinics to help grow the game worldwide. She was a member of the 1964 World Series Team and was named All-American first team. She had the winning hit in the final game of the World Series with a runner at second. She broke her bat and the hit went short into center field. She has been inducted into the Oregon Softball Hall of Fame which is located at Erv Lind Stadium at Normandale Park on 57th and Halsey, where a number of PIL teams still call home for softball teams.



John Bakkensen (Grant High School, 1961) Track and Field

High School Honors: 3 Track and Field letters. Won the PIL discus championship and set new PIL meet records in the discus throw as a Junior and Senior; 3rd in State as a Junior and first as a Senior and set a new State meet record in 1961. Won Oregon AAU meet as a Junior with a throw of 170' 8.25 inches, the farthest in State history among high schoolers at that time and became nationally ranked. Served as Student Body President.


Post High School Career: 4 Track and Field letters at Harvard University. Set a Harvard record in the discus and was Penn Relays champion as a Sophomore and won the Heptagonal championship his final three years. He also won the Heptagonal Championship (all Ivy League colleges plus Army & Navy Academies) three years in a row, placed first in the IC4A (Eastern conference colleges) in 1964 and 1965, setting the IC4A conference meet record in '65. He set a Harvard record of 179'9" in the 1964 USTFF Championship meet, finishing second to Olympian Jay Sylvester. While attending Law School at Stanford he volunteered as T&F coach with Head Coach Payton Jordan. His best career mark with the Olympic weight discus was 201'1" on May 8, 1971 at Central Washington University, a stadium record to this day.

Terry Brown (Grant High School, 1960) Football, Wrestling, Track

<u>High School Honors:</u> Earned 4 Letters in Wrestling, 3 in Football and 2 in Track & Field. Was PIL wrestling champion in the unlimited weight class as a senior. Starting tackle in Shrine All-Star game. National Merit Scholar.

<u>Post High School Career:</u> Played freshman football at Stanford University before knee injuries sidelined him. Graduated from Portland State University in 1968 with B.S. degree in Economics. U.S. Marine Corp. for three years. Career includes Jantzen, 8 years; Oil Drilling 4 years; and retired from Columbia Sportswear in 2001 as Vice President.





John Percich (Grant High School, 1969) Football, Baseball

High School Honors: 3 Letters each in Football and Baseball. 1st team All-PIL as a Junior and Senior in Football with league championships both years. 2nd team All-PIL as a Senior in Baseball, also a championship season. Defensive MVP in Shrine All-Star game as a Senior. Member of Grant Hall of Fame.

Post High School Career: Played football at Portland State University on a full scholarship in 1969 and 1970, but an injury in 1971 ended his grid career. John coached Sunset youth football 7th graders for 17 years. He had a career in food services which included lobbying five different times in Washington D.C. to get a farm bill passed so children had nutritious school meals. He was President of the Oregon School Food Service Association. In 1995 John created the Tualatin Valley Youth Football League, now the 2nd largest youth football league in the country with more than 7500 players in grades 3 through 8. He coached Liberty baseball in 2018-19.

Bob Weaver (Grant High School, 1961) Football, Wrestling

High School Honors: 3 Letters each in Football and Wrestling. 2nd team All-PIL as a Junior and 1st team as a Senior in Football. 3rd in State as a Senior in Wrestling, 191lb weight class.

Post High School Career: Played football at Oregon State University, He was sidelined with knee injuries in second year. BS degree in Humanities & Social Science at Oregon State University, 1965. Completed graduate studies in Human Resources and Labor Relations at University of Oregon, 1968. Worked 7 years for Hyster Company in Human Resources and Labor Relations. Cofounder and COO in 1980 of executive and technical recruiting firm in both domestic and international heavy process industries. Retired from firm after 27 years. During the same years, Bob coached youth football for 8 seasons and was active in local school committees and in his church. After retiring in 2007 he served with his church on hurricane, storm, flood and earthquake restoration missions in the Midwest, South and Haiti. He also helped with a school for girls in India.

Susan Davis (Weitzel) (Jackson High School, 1978) Gymnastics, Track & Field, Softball, Cheer High School Honors: 4 Letters in Gymnastics, 1st Team All-PIL as a Sophomore (vault) and 2nd Team as a Junior. Her Team finished 3rd in State her Senior year where she competed in vault. 1 Letter in Track & Field as a Sophomore. 1 Letter in Basketball Cheerleading as a Junior, and 1 Letter in Softball as a Senior where she was named All-West 1st Team Pitcher.

Post High School Career: 1-year Softball letter at Linfield University and 1-year gymnastics letter (vault) at Portland State University. Coached Little League Softball for 7 years; coached gymnastics 3 years each for the Portland Parks and Multnomah Athletic Club. Coached Varsity Competitive and Sideline Cheer at Grant for 16 years with a 5th in State in 2008. Inducted into Grant Hall of Fame in 2016 for Community Service. Presently in a 15-year career as Softball coach at Grant.





Brandon Brooks (Jefferson High School, 2000) Football, Basketball

High School Honors: 1 Letter in Football as a Senior. 4 Letters in Basketball. 1st Team All-PIL as a Sophomore while attending Grant and averaged 29 points per game, including back-to-back games of 60 and 58 points. 1st Team All-PIL as a Senior at Jefferson in a 28-0 season and City and State Championships. 1st Team All-tourney and PIL and OSAA Player of the Year; Gatorade Player of the Year, and USA Today All-American Honorable Mention in Junior and Senior years. Included in the top 25 players from Oregon in the modern era

Post High School Career: Played basketball 1 year at Indian Hills Community College in Iowa, 1st team all-league and final four in national tournament; and 1st team National Junior College All-American. Went to University of Southern California to play basketball, but suffered significant ligament damage with a broken ankle during practice, ending his basketball playing career. Coaches with the Rose City Rebels AAU basketball program in Portland and provides personalized basketball instruction in the Los Angeles area.

Mark Burke, Jr. (Jefferson High School, 1993) Football, Soccer, Basketball, Baseball

High School Honors: Lettered in Soccer (2X), Basketball (2X) and Baseball at Cleveland and led the PIL in goals with 17 as a 1st Team All-PIL Soccer player as a Junior at Cleveland. 1 FB letter. 1st Team All-PIL in Baseball as a Junior and Senior at Jefferson; All-State as a Senior and led the State with a .540 batting average. 1st Team All-PIL quarterback as a Senior with PIL leading 14 TD passes and PIL championship. State-Metro All-Star game starter, OSAA US Bank Scholar Athlete of the Year and Multnomah Athletic Club Scholar Athlete.

Post High School Career: Baseball at Texarkana JC and 1st Team East Texas Conf. All-Star; Portland State University 1 year; 1997 MLB Draft by the Atlanta Braves and All-Star Selection for Northwest League 1997 and Northern League 2000. (10-year Minor League career) Starting in 2007 served as the General Manager for several high-end health clubs in Boston. Owns/operates a SERVPRO franchise in San Jose, CA since 2018; family presently living in Cheshire, Connecticut.

Lincoln Boys Take Home Championship Trophy

at OSAA State Track & Field Meet

PIL student-athletes were among the top performers at the 2023 OSAA Track & Field State Championships at Hayward Field on May 25th - 27th. Lincoln boys claimed its first team title since 2007 by winning the 4x400, the final event, behind sophomore Ryan Hendrickson, freshman Nicholas Ranalli, senior Alexander Rhodes and junior Nathan Davidson. Their 10 points proved to be the difference for the Cardinals, who finished with 55 points, pushing past Sheldon (51). Lincoln's Grant Nyhus was the state champion in the triple jump. Nikki Prall took 2nd in the Pole Vault, with Alex Rhodes taking home the gold in the 400m. Roosevelt boys finished 6th overall, a huge accomplishment for the season. Will Heslam took 1st place finishes in the 1500m, breaking the state meet record, and in the 800m. Heslam is committed to running at the University of Oregon next year. Nywan Campbell took 3rd in the discus and 4th in shot put. On the girls' side, Ellie Heslam took 3rd in the 400m, with Havana Alonso taking 2nd in the Javelin. Franklin's Ethan Aman took 5th in state in the Shot Put. setting a new PR of 50.03. This was the 1st "over 50 ft throw" for Franklin in 14 years. Junior Maleigha Canaday Elliot from McDaniel won the state championship in the triple jump, with a score of 40'6.
