This newsletter features the 25 men and 11 women to be inducted spanning five and a half decades—1960-2015. Six will be joining relatives already in the PIL HOF.

This will be the first year under a sponsorship banner—the Denny Sullivan Foundation, honoring the long-time Grant track coach. This 36th Induction Banquet will be Nov. 2 at the DoubleTree by Hilton Lloyd Center.

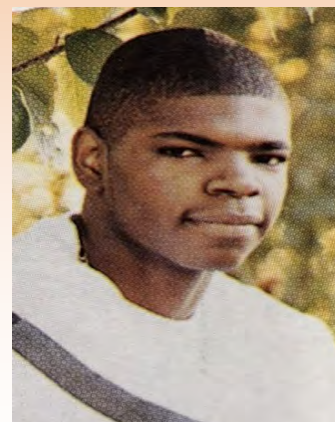
The Portland Interscholastic League (PIL) has been in existence since 1900. Since 1981, the PIL Hall of Fame has received nominations from each of the high schools in the Portland Public Schools district. The nominations for athletes, coaches and administrators are reviewed and voted upon to determine a particular year's inductees. Athletes are considered for induction on or after ten years following their year of graduation. Coaches and administrators are considered following their retirement. The inductees for the Class of 2025 include athletes,

coaches and administrators from the years 1960 to 2015.. Congratulations to you and welcome to the PIL Hall of Fame.

Darren Cooper, Benson, Class of 2001 (Basketball)

High School Honors-2 Basketball letters. 1st Team All-PIL, 1st Team All-State, and 1st Team All-Tournament as a Senior. Holds record for highest free throw percentage at OSAA championship, 26 for 26, set in 2001.

Post High School Career-Attended Eastern Washington University for one year; University of Portland three years, earned BA degree in General Studies 2007. Played G-league professional basketball for 5 years in four different states. Taught individual basketball skills in his own company Quiet Storm Basketball for 3 years; Since 2012, he has built a successful career in Information Technology and presently as a Solution Architect for Kyocera Document Solutions West in Irvine, CA. He continues to mentor inner-city youth through basketball. He is the nephew of PIL HOF's Woodrow Green, Jefferson '70, inducted in 2016.



Kory Murphy, Benson, Class of 1991. (Football, Track & Field)

High School Honors-2 Football letters. 1st Team All-PIL wide receiver with over 1,000 receiving yards and 14 TDs; 2nd Team All-State as a Senior; 2 Track & Field letters, on 1990 State T&F Championship team as a junior; PIL 100m and 200m champion as a Senior; 4th in 100m in State as senior.

Post High School Career-Full football scholarship to University of Oregon; 2-year starter as wide receiver, played on 1994-95 Duck Rose Bowl team. Co-founded the NW Accelerator, a groundbreaking initiative for underserved climate tech entrepreneurs. Coached football at Benson 2 years and for 4 years helped develop the youth football program for Jefferson area 3rd through 8th graders. Now Program Officer for Lemelson Foundation of Portland supporting underserved entrepreneurs.

Guy Nelson, Benson, Class of 1998. (Football)

High School Honors-3 football letters. All-PIL defensive end as a Junior and Senior; Honorable Mention All-State as Junior and Senior; on Oregon Shrine all-star team as Senior.

Post High School Career-A two-year starting linebacker at Walla Walla Community College; outside linebacker and special team player at Portland State University for two years; starter as a Senior. Earned BA Degree in Urban and Public Affairs. Has served as an Oregon State trooper for over 30 years in the Willamette Valley.



Kisha Swafford-Gayhart, Benson, Class of 1998. (Basketball, Track & Field)

High School Honors-3 Basketball letters. All-PIL 2nd team as Senior. 4 Track & Field letters, On State 4x100m Championship relay team as a Sophomore; State Champion at 100m, 200m, and 4x100m Relay Team as a Senior.

Post High School Career-Associate Degree from Portland Community College, 2000; attended Warner Pacific College. Served in Portland Public Schools 2000-2013 in High Needs Special Education; In-home care for Seniors with Special Needs from 2013-2021. Currently a teacher in Camas School District working with special needs students. Inducted into Benson Hall of Fame, 2024.

Howard Lao, Cleveland, Class of 2010. (Soccer, Track & Field)

High School Honors-1 Soccer letter. 4 Track & Field letters, six-time All PIL Champion—4 years in the 110m Hurdle (set State meet record of 14.32 as a Senior) twice PIL winner of 300m Hurdles. Athlete of the meet his Senior year. All American for 7th place finish at the USTF Junior Olympics, twice Scholar Athlete, Royal C as T&F MVP, Track Team Captain, and scored 19 points in Cleveland's 4th place State finish as a Senior.

Post High School Career-2 T&F letters at The University of Washington (#7 All-time in 60m indoor hurdles); 2x top 10 finish at the PAC10 Championships. BA degree in Communications, 2015. Hurdles Coach at Cleveland High past 10 years; coached both a girl and boy in State Hurdles finals last year. (Best finish in school history) His award-winning Sports photography has taken him to Olympic Trials 3 times and World Championships 4 times.



Sam G. McIntyre, Cleveland, Class of 2007. (Football, Baseball)

High School Honors-3 Football letters, All-PIL as a Junior and Senior; on PIL Championship Offense and Defense teams as a Senior; Defensive player of the year as a Senior; on Les Schwab Bowl All-Star team as Senior; National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete finalist. Royal C recipient, MVP and Team Captain as a Senior. 2 Baseball letters, All PIL centerfielder and on PIL Championship Team as a Senior.

Post High School Career-BS degree in Business Administration at University of Oregon 2011; from 2017 to 2014 worked at Cloud/Axcient Technology, San Francisco, last year at Denver; presently with Amazon Web Service in Portland.

Julie Ann Willis, Cleveland, Class of 1975. (Basketball, Volleyball, Track & Field)

High School Honors-2 Basketball Letters, 1st Team All-PIL as a Senior. 1 Volleyball Letter. 2 Track & Field letters (Javelin), On 2 PIL City Championship teams. Softball wasn't a PIL sport then, but Julie played 4 years on CYO and city championship teams and was an all-star shortstop in 1973.

Post High School Career-Julie attended Whitman College and lettered 1 year in Basketball. A Washington to Maine cross-country bike trek helped inspire her to become a competitive mountain bike racer from 1984-88. 5th in the Mammoth Mountain Downhill World Championships; 3rd at the National Off Road Bicycling Assn. Championship, 1985. After completing College of Utah Massage Therapy 1988-89 and University of Utah Human Anatomy/Neuroanatomy 1988-92 she became a Massage Therapist. 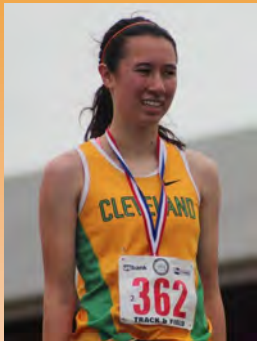


Daniel Winn, Cleveland, Class of 2012 (Cross Country, Track & Field)

Career Highlights-Served in the U.S. Navy from 1971-77 as a Machinist Mate on two different Destroyers. Played basketball at Portland State University 1980-81 (program eliminated in 1981). Continued basketball career at Clark College 1981-82 and Concordia University 1982-84. Graduated from Concordia University with a BS degree in Secondary Education. High School Basketball Coach 37 years. Taught Physical Education 29 years in Portland Public Schools: (Marshall HS, Franklin HS, Wilson HS) from 1986 to 2014. PIL Basketball Coach of the Year 7 times; Athletic Director at Franklin HS 4 years, at Wilson HS 8 years. PIL Athletic Director of the Year 3 times; Oregon Boys Basketball Coach of the Year in 2020 by National Federation of High Schools. All time Boys Basketball wins leader at Franklin HS (106) and Wilson HS (245); 18 playoff appearances; Robert Blanchard PIL Distinguished Service Award 2013-14; Also coached football, volleyball, tennis, golf, and baseball.



***Ken Bolder, Franklin, Class of 1968. (Football, Wrestling, Track & Field)**

Only American to win a match vs. Japanese in 1968 Portland exhibition (heavyweight). 3 Track & Field letters. PIL Scholar Athlete and FHS Most Athletic Male as a Senior.

Post High School Career-Football 2 years at US Air Force Academy. Enlisted in US Army, 1970; completed parachute training at Ft. Benning non-commissioned officer's school. Completed Special Forces training as a medic and became a Green Beret, serving with 173rd Airborne in Viet Nam. He became a member of the legendary Old Guard, the 1st Infantry Regiment that protects the tomb of the unknown soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. After the Service, he apprenticed as a diesel mechanic for Feenaughty Machinery Co. and died in a single car accident 10/26/1976 enroute to a job site in the Cascades.

Denise Griffith Jensen, Grant, Class of 1973 (Gymnastics)

High School Honors-3 letters in gymnastics. She was PIL All-Around Gymnastics Champion in 1970 and 1971, State Champion in the Floor Exercise, All-around Gymnast State Champion, and State Champion in the Uneven Bars and the Balance Beam. AAU Junior National Champion, qualified for the Pan-American Games at age 15. Finished 4th in Senior Nationals to qualify for 1972 Olympic Trials in which she was a runner-up Olympian. Received Grant scholar-athlete award, 1971. Performed with National Gymnastics team, 1972. Inducted into Grant Hall of Fame, 2016.

Post High School Career-Coached her own gymnastics team for 3 years in Junior Olympics in the mid-70's. Attended Mt. Hood CC for one year, graduated from Portland State University with BS in Biology cum laude, 1982. Graduated cum laude at OHSU with a Medical Degree in 1986. Practiced emergency medicine for 30 years at trauma centers in Portland and Seattle vicinities. Currently serves many retirement communities teaching cardiopulmonary resuscitation and use of Automatic External Defibrillators. Remains physically active in the equestrian sport of Dressage.



Ted Notos, Grant, Class of 1978 (Basketball, Baseball)

High School Honors-3 Basketball letters. 4 Baseball letters as a Pitcher, All PIL Honorable Mention as Freshman; 2nd team as Sophomore. All-PIL and All-State as a Junior and Senior and wins and strike-out leader both years. Named Metro All-Star Series Most Valuable Pitcher.

Post High School Career-Drafted by the San Francisco Giants; didn't sign. Went to UC Santa Barbara but injured pitching elbow in his first year. 2 baseball letters at Linn Benton CC, two-time Conference champions 1979-80; played in JUCO World Series both years; named with 1979 Team to Linn-Benton Hall of Fame. Became a race horse owner 1985-96; Varsity Head Baseball Coach at Colton High School from 1994-2005; 30-year career with Notos Estate Sales in Sherwood.

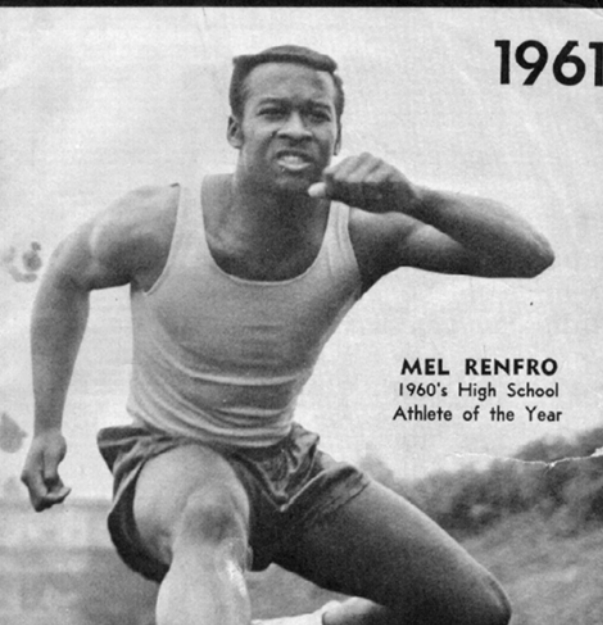
